♦ INVESTING IN THE FUTURE

In order to consider the cost of attending Bright College, it is critical to review the whole picture. The price of Bright College is \$18,678 per academic year, including a \$178 student activity fee, but that does not mean it will be every student's out-of-pocket cost.

We strive to offer scholarships to lower the cost when financial need is demonstrated. After deducting the Estimated Family Contribution (calculated by the FAFSA), the remainder of the tuition & fees will be fully covered with a combination of scholarships, grants, and a Federal Direct Subsidized Loan not to exceed \$1,500. (Valid for lowa residents who enroll as first-time, full-time college students in the Fall 2021 semester, and who complete the 2021-2022 FAFSA by July 1, 2021.)

Room and board is available, but not required for Bright College students.
