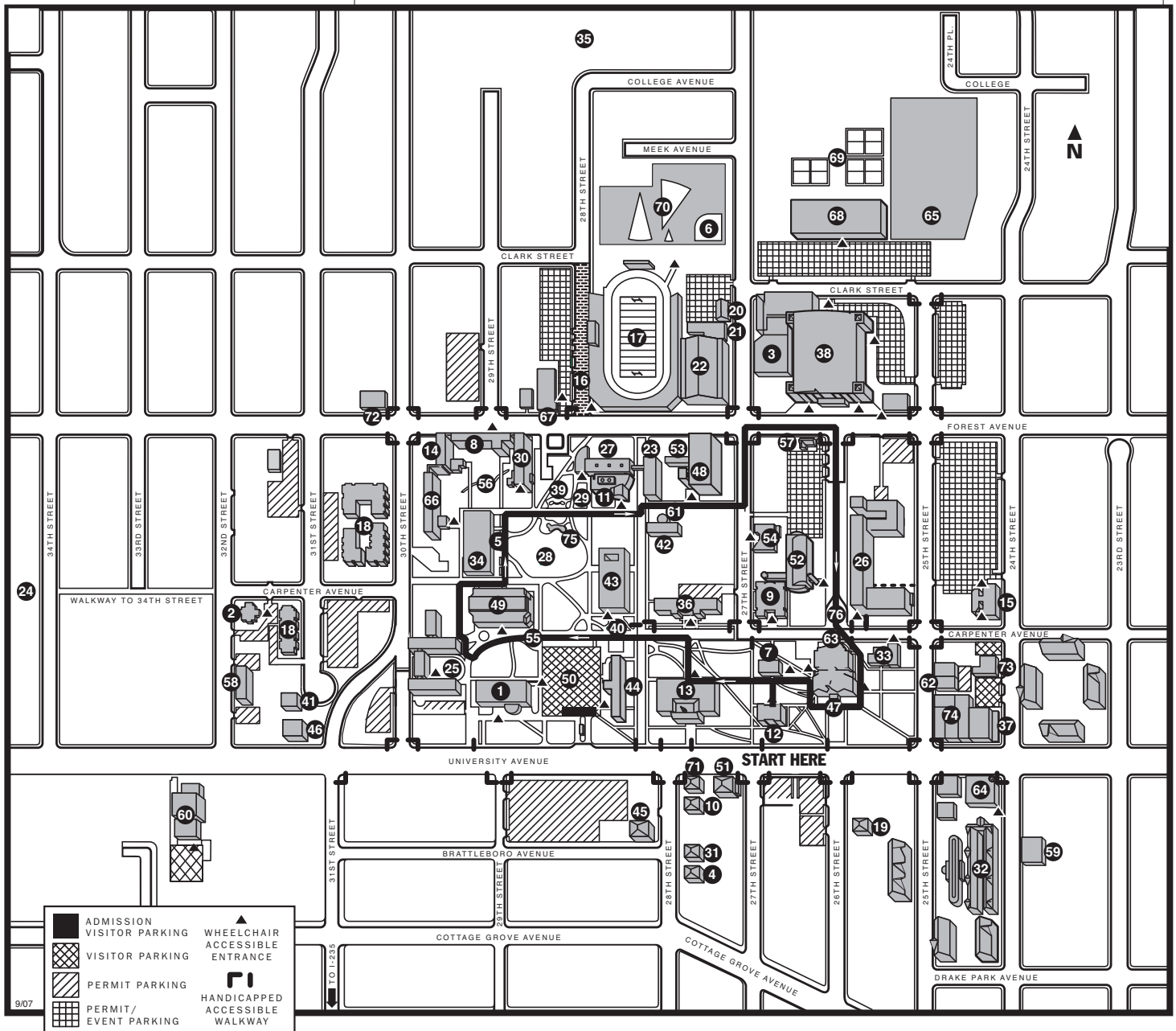

### ☛ 12 Cole Hall: Office of Admission

You'll find the offices of Undergraduate, International and Graduate Admission here. Open Monday through Friday, 8 a.m. to 4:30 p.m. year-round.

### 13 Cowles Library

An exciting blend of classic volumes and cutting-edge technology, Cowles Library contains more than 600,000 books and journals, nearly 100,000 government documents, 22,000 scholarly online journals and 118 electronic databases, as well as a computer lab and quiet study areas.

### Painted Street (Carpenter Avenue)

Drake's painted street, located just north of Cowles Library, is white-washed in April and new colorful squares are painted by student organizations as an annual event to kick off Drake Relays festivities.

### 36 Jewett Residence Hall

Jewett houses approximately 150 upperclass students.

### 44 Morehouse Residence Hall

Morehouse is home to approximately 135 upperclass students.

### 43 Meredith Hall

The School of Journalism and Mass Communication resides here, with the Kragie-Newell Interactive Media Lab on the main level and a TV production studio and digital editing suite on the lower level. Also in Meredith are classrooms and several departments of the College of Arts and Sciences.

### 1 Aliber Hall

This building is home of the College of Business and Public Administration, its classrooms, PC computer lab and offices.

### 25 Goodwin-Kirk Residence Hall Complex

Two residence halls join to form the largest hall on campus. Approximately 485 upperclassmen live in G-K.

### 49 Olmsted Center

The recently renovated Olmsted Center includes the D-Shoppe (where you'll find Drake apparel, greeting cards, magazines and snacks), the Student Life Center, the Pomerantz Student Union (complete with free pool tables, dart boards, a stage and e-mail terminals), the Bulldog Lounge and a coffee cart. The terrace cafeteria on the lower level is one of three locations where students may use their meal contracts.

### 34 Hubbell Dining Hall

Drake's primary dining hall and one of three locations where students may use their meal contracts, Hubbell serves a wide variety of tastes, from international to traditional. Spike's offers late-night pizzas, submarine sandwiches and convenience items.

### 8 14 30 66 The Quads

Carpenter, Crawford, Herriott and Stalnaker residence halls, connected by bridges and walkways, house approximately 200 students each. All first-year students live in the Quads.

### 11 Morgan E. Cline Hall of Pharmacy and Science

The main building for the College of Pharmacy and Health Sciences holds classrooms, laboratories and offices.

### 42 61 Medbury Hall and Scott Chapel

Medbury holds the departments of Philosophy, Religion, and Rhetoric and Communication Studies as well as the Honors Program. Attached to Medbury is Scott Chapel, used for private devotions and special events.

### 27 Harvey Ingham Hall

The Physics and Chemistry departments and state-of-the-art labs are in Ingham. A skywalk connects Ingham with Fitch Hall.

### 23 Fitch Hall

This pharmacy facility contains offices and a practice lab.

### 48 Olin Hall

Home of the Biology and Psychology departments, Olin has classrooms, laboratories and the Pioneer Hi-Bred International Greenhouse and Environmental Instructional Facility.

### 17 22 Drake Stadium and Fieldhouse

Go Bulldogs! Cheer on the football team and enjoy the annual Drake Relays in Drake Stadium. The Fieldhouse has athletic offices, a basketball court and an indoor track.

### 6 70 Athletic Fields

Just north of the stadium are Buel Softball Field and the track and field throws venue.

### 3 Bell Center

The recreation facility is headquarters for Drake's wellness and intramural programs and where you'll find a 25-meter indoor pool, basketball/volleyball courts, aerobics room, locker rooms and a fitness room with exercise machines and Nautilus equipment.

### 38 68 Knapp Center and Tennis Center

This 7,002-seat arena is Drake's home court advantage for both men's and women's NCAA Division I basketball and women's volleyball. The facility also provides recreational basketball/volleyball courts, four racquetball courts, weight room and an indoor track. Directly north is the Tennis Center with six indoor and six outdoor tennis courts.

### 62 Campus Security

Campus Security officers are headquartered here but work across campus 24 hours a day, seven days a week. Drake's campus crime rate is one of the lowest in the nation.

### 26 Harmon Fine Arts Center and Anderson Gallery

FAC holds the Art and Design, Music and Theatre Arts departments and performance facilities as well as the College of Arts and Sciences administrative offices. The Anderson Gallery provides space for student, faculty and guest art exhibitions.

### 9 52 Cartwright Hall and Opperman Hall and Law Library

Home of Drake's Law School, Cartwright is mainly classrooms and offices while Opperman Hall is the law library.

### ☛ 47 Old Main and ☛ 63 Sheslow Auditorium

Built in 1882-83, Old Main was the first permanent building on campus. It now houses the offices of the President, Provost, Registrar, Student Accounts and other administrative areas. Adjacent is Sheslow Auditorium, a beautiful 775-seat facility used for concerts, recitals, guest speakers and campus programs.

### ☛ 33 Howard Hall

Here are classrooms and offices of the departments of English, Mathematics and Computer Science, and Sociology.

### ☛ 7 Carnegie Hall

Formerly the Law Library, this building houses Office of Information Technology and the Office of Student Financial Planning. The Graphic Design department is located here, too.
