**Documenting Interventions  
Advanced Practice Experiences**

1. A minimum of 10 interventions must be documented in E\*Value for any patient-care rotation in order to satisfy the documentation requirements for course credit. Interventions are considered “actions” taken on your part. For example, you may identify two drug therapy problems and call the prescriber (Intervention #1), counsel the patient (Intervention #2) and follow up with that same patient a week later (Intervention #3). Drug therapy problems in and of themselves do not count as individual interventions.
2. Do **NOT** use any patient protected health information (name, initials, medical record numbers, birth date etc in note) in SOAP Note/Intervention/Drug Therapy Problem.
3. Do **NOT** use any facilities identifiers in SOAP Note/Intervention. No floor, room or bed numbers. Do not name the facility. No physician names etc.
4. Violations of the instructions in #2 and #3 are a breach of the confidentiality agreements signed by all students and may also violate Federal HIPPA regulations.
5. Complete all areas of intervention form by checking the appropriate boxes.
6. Complete a focused SOAP note related to the intervention. The SOAP note should comply with the following:
  - Subjective information should include information gathered from the patient or family member and relevant to the drug therapy problem (HPI, ROS).
  - Objective information should include information from your direct observation of the patient (general survey), vital signs, physical examination results, medication history from MAR or patient profile, laboratory or diagnostic tests relevant to the DTP.
  - Assessment should be the statement of the DTP (e.g. wrong drug) and your rationale for your assessment based on the subjective and objective information.
  - Plan should include recommendations for correction of the drug therapy problem, specific monitoring parameters for both efficacy and side effects and specific recommendation for follow-up.
7. Remember this is a focused SOAP relevant only to the intervention/DTP(s) identified. Multiple drug therapy problems can be documented within one intervention entry but remember that it is the “action” you took that counts as the intervention, not the drug therapy problem itself.
8. The SOAP note should be complete enough that another student/pharmacy/preceptor could read your note and complete all necessary follow-up and monitoring without reviewing the chart.
9. Preceptors are asked to review each intervention and confirm it as an accurate representation of events.
