Doctor of Education — Applications accepted on or after May 1st in odd-numbered years and must be complete by December 1 of that year. The doctoral program begins in the fall term of even-numbered years.

School of Education applicants: Applicants may enroll in up to six credit hours prior to being admitted to a program. Admission decisions must be made at least one month prior to the end of that term, or the applications will be updated to the next term. This is very important because if applications are updated, applicants will not be eligible for financial aid for the term to which they originally applied. 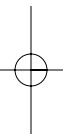
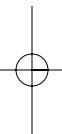
