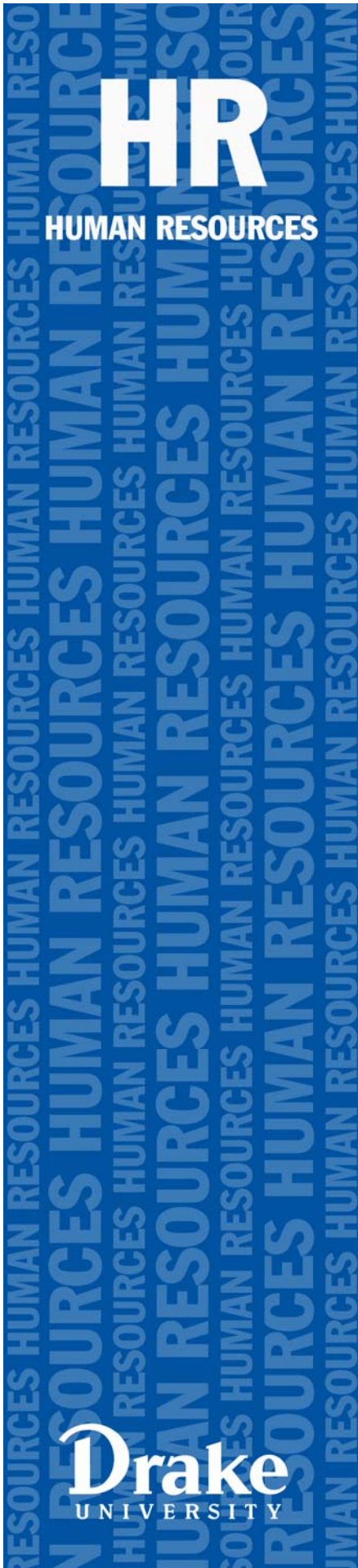

EXCELLENCE IN LEARNING AND DEVELOPMENT PROGRAM CERTIFICATE

Drake University values life-long learning among its faculty, staff and students. The Drake University Excellence in Learning and Development Program is designed with that in mind; emphasizing that varied and frequent learning opportunities enhance personal and professional growth and effectiveness.

The Excellence in Learning and Development Program includes many diverse offerings from which to choose. This booklet includes information about each of the program's offerings and facilitators. Additional sessions may be added throughout the year.

Once again, participants have the opportunity to earn an Excellence in Learning and Development Certificate by completing eight (8) hours of HR approved learning.

PROGRAM SCHEDULE AND OFFERINGS

Human Resources worked with various internal and external facilitators to design a comprehensive learning and development program. Each session is customized for Drake University; taking into account our culture, values and diverse operations. Special emphasis is placed on creating a learning environment conducive to a variety of learning styles and development needs. Feedback from various groups was solicited in determining appropriate topics, program schedules and facilitators.

In addition to the sessions offered by Human Resources, the Drake University Information Technology Department and the Drake Telemedia Center also offer on-campus training and development opportunities. Facilitator Bios

SHERRY BARRETT - As a consultant, facilitator, trainer and coach, Sherry Barrett has assisted private and public organizations to improve communication, employee and systems productivity, manage change, and live their strategic values, mission and vision. Sherry has taught business and career planning courses at several colleges: Aquinas College, The Davenport College of Business, Drake University and North Iowa Area Community College. Sherry earned degrees in English, Education and Leadership. She is the author of *Keep Them Calling! Superior Service on the Telephone*.

SAVANNAH BAO - A native of Jiangsu province, Savannah Bao earned a B.A. in Management from Fudan University in Shanghai, an M.A. in Educational Psychology from the University of Colorado at Denver, and is pursuing a doctorate in education at Drake University. She is currently the assistant director of Drake's Chinese Cultural Exchange Program.

BROOKE BENSCHOTER - Brooke is the Drake University Director Marketing and Communications. She has had a 20-year career in corporate communications, advertising, public relations, brand management and marketing with organizations such as Pioneer Hi-Bred International Inc., Meredith Corp., ITAGroup and the National Pork Board. She has worked on brand strategies for names like Frito-Lay, Texas Instruments, Mothers Against Drunk Driving and General Motors. She is currently working on a book about internal branding based on her experience.

SUSAN BREAKENRIDGE - Susan Breakenridge is the Coordinator of Administrative Services at Cowles Library and has been at the library for 13 years. She earned her Masters of Business Administration and Specialist in Education from Drake and is currently working toward her Doctorate in Education. She has a combination of over eight years of teaching experience at Drake, Grand View College and Upper Iowa University.

JUL BRUNS - As a Workplace Services Consultant, Jul provides companies with consultation, servicing, and training. Jul has presented on various topics; such as Conflict Management, Listening Skills, Stress Management and Resiliency, Managing Change, Ethics, and Work Life Balance. Jul Bruns is a Licensed Mental Health Counselor and has worked for Employee and Family Resources for over seven years.

MARK FERRARA - Mark has taught at Kyungnam University in South Korea, Fudan University in China, and on a Fulbright fellowship at Middle East Technical University in Turkey. He currently directs Drake University's Chinese Cultural Exchange Program and teaches world literature in the English department.

BRUCE GILBERT - Bruce Gilbert is the Director of Digital Libraries and Instruction at Cowles Library. He has been at Drake for 14 years. In addition to supervising the Library's growing instructional efforts, Bruce co-taught the Library's first "Information Literacy" courses, and taught one of Drake's first Web courses.

ERIC JOHNSON - Dr. Johnson is an Assistant Professor and Director of the Urban Education program in the School of Education at Drake University. He has experience working with urban and suburban districts to improve student academic performance. Moreover, he has facilitated numerous workshops with students, administrators, and teachers designed to develop cultural competency skills that promote learning in academically diverse settings. In the last two years he has started a research agenda that includes international implications of urban education. As a result, he has done research in Russia, China, and Nicaragua.

JENNY LASHIER - Jenny Lashier created the P.O.W.E.R. Business Writing course and has a passion for helping others hone their writing and communication skills. She earned a bachelor's degree in Public Relations from the A.Q. Miller School of Journalism at Kansas State University and her master's degree in Professional Studies in Higher Education from Iowa State University. Jenny has been training and consulting for ten years and teaches courses on Teambuilding, Time Management, and Email Essentials.

GLENN MCKNIGHT - Associate Professor Glenn McKnight teaches African history at Drake. His research touches on Uganda's early colonial history and on current theories and practices of development. He has lived, researched, and traveled in Uganda. He is presently establishing a five credit hour study abroad course in conjunction with Dr. Jimmy Senteza, which will take Drake students to Uganda for a 3-week study tour in summer 2007. The intent of this course is to give Drake students a first-hand taste of cultural life and livelihood issues that people in Uganda face everyday.

VENESSA MACRO - Venessa Macro is the Director, Human Resources at Drake University. She earned her Bachelor of Arts degree in Political Science at the University of Northern Iowa and her Doctor of Jurisprudence at Drake University Law School. Venessa came to Drake University after seven years as labor and employment counsel for Meredith Corporation.

DAVID SKIDMORE - David Skidmore is a Professor in the Department of Politics and International Relations at Drake University. He received his Ph.D. from Stanford University and taught at Hamilton College and the University of Notre Dame before arriving at Drake in 1989. During 1996-97 academic year, he taught at the Johns Hopkins Nanjing University Center for Chinese and American Studies in Nanjing, China. He currently serves as Director of the Drake University Center for Global Citizenship and is past Director of the Drake Curriculum and First Year Seminar programs.

JIMMY SENTEZA - Dr. Senteza is an Associate Professor of Finance in the College of Business and Public Administration at Drake. Jimmy has taught several courses in finance including introductory finance, corporate finance, international finance, investment analysis, and portfolio management. Together with Professor Glenn McKnight, he has developed a five credit hour study abroad course that will give Drake University students a first-hand experience of efforts to attain sustainable development in a sub-Saharan country, Uganda.

KAREN WALLACE - Karen Wallace is Circulation/Reference Librarian and Professor of Librarianship at the Drake University Law Library. Immediately prior to coming to Drake in 2000, Karen was Head of Community Services at the Des Plaines Public Library, where she helped overhaul the employee orientation program. She earned a B.A. in Religion and an M.A. in Library and Information Science from the University of Iowa. Karen is an active member of the American Association of Law Libraries and Mid-America Association of Law Libraries.
