6. Availability of Instructional Resources and Information Technology dedicated to supporting student learning.

Drake University learning technology resources are extensive. This will provide a brief summary, with additional information available in the report and on campus.

Some major points:

1. All classroom buildings, libraries, residence halls, and student center building are wireless.
2. The University provides extensive learning labs that are designed to support either general or specialized learning needs or both. Every classroom building and several other buildings on campus have computer an/or other facilities that provide technology to support student learning. Many of these facilities are used for classes, but also are available for students to work independently.

In addition to these there are several open labs for student uses. Several buildings also provide student lounge/study spaces with computers.

Three labs also are available primarily for staff and faculty training and development.

3. Cowles Library is a digitally sophisticated learning space. The information commons provides 49 networked computers that are equipped with standard Microsoft Office, plus Mathematica and other specialized software. Cowles library also has a multimedia classroom and a small classroom computer lab. The library also has over a 1000 DVDs and CDs, provides Electronic access to databases, journals, periodicals, government documents and other learning resources.

4. Use of the specialized labs is monitored by the programs that they support. Those programs generally are responsible for monitoring hardware and software needs as well.
