DU England: Harlaxton Faculty-in-Residence: Fall 2025 Eligibility, Compensation, Responsibilities, Application and Courses

Drake University offers a cohort-model semester study abroad program in England in partnership with Harlaxton College and the University of Evansville. As a part of the fall semester program, a Drake faculty member travels to Harlaxton with the students to teach and serve in various other capacities to support the program abroad as Facultyin-Residence.

Program Details:

- DU England runs each fall semester with a different Drake instructor going as the Faculty-in-Residence with a cohort of 10-20 Drake students.
- Harlaxton provides on-site support (executive director and extensive staff), accommodations, transportation, classroom space, faculty office space, cultural activities and program excursions, health insurance, and emergency assistance coverage.
- Dates for fall semester: Faculty arrive August 26, 2025 and depart December 11, 2025
- The Drake faculty leader will teach two, 3-credit undergraduate courses meeting an AOI and taking advantage of the program location. Typically, one course will be a lower-level intro course with broad appeal, with the second course being topical or an elective. Drake students on the program are required to take one of the two courses, some choose to enroll in both. These courses are open to other students on the Harlaxton program.
- The students' semester schedule is rounded out by enrolling in other Harlaxton College course offerings, taught by British and visiting faculty.

Eligibility:

- Applicants need to be on full-time, tenured, or ongoing continuous (e.g. Professor of Practice) faculty appointments at Drake University at the time of application.
- Preference will be given to applicants who have experience teaching a Drake travel seminar or experience working with Drake students in an international setting prior to applying.
- Preference will be given to applicants who have not yet served as Faculty-in-Residence on a Drake semester program abroad.
- There is a minimum of five-year duration between periods of service as Faculty-in-Residence on a Drake semester program abroad.
- You may not be on sabbatical for the year prior to your time serving as Faculty-in-Residence.

Compensation:

- You will remain on your Drake salary and benefits while you are teaching at Harlaxton.
- You will be provided with:
 - Accommodations at Harlaxton Manor with internet access
 - 3 meals a day provided at Harlaxton refectory
 - Stipend to use towards a phone solution of your choice for program related calls
 - International flight
 - International health insurance and emergency assistance coverage

Responsibilities: Before Departure

- Develop course proposals and submit for approvals through your college's curriculum committee. Work with Harlaxton's Academic Program Manager to solidify course-related activities and excursions.
- Submit proposal for AOI approvals through the University Curriculum Committee.
- Take an active role in recruiting for the program through information sessions, classroom visits, fairs or events, communicating with prospective program students, and more.
- Hold a program specific pre-departure orientation the spring semester prior to your time abroad.

While Abroad

- Participate in arrival procedures, welcoming students to Harlaxton
- Participate in on-site orientation
- Teach two courses and participate in all course-related activities and excursions
- Meet with the Drake cohort once a week outside of class to connect with students and facilitate group reflection
- Oversight and accountability for Drake participants and primary point of contact
- Be available to students by keeping regular office hours
- Responsive communication with the Global Engagement office

Post Program

- Hold a post-program/re-entry session the spring after the program returns
- Assist the Global Engagement office by:
 - Completing a comprehensive report on your time as Faculty-in-Residence
 - Turning in complete expense reports in a timely manner
 - Serving as a mentor to future Faculty-in-Residence for the DU England: Harlaxton semester program
 - Assist with recruitment and orientation for future DU England: Harlaxton participants
 - Assist on assessment and program recommendations

Application

By completing the DU England: Harlaxton Faculty-in-Residence application, you will be considered for the Fall 2025 program. In submitting your application, you agree to the responsibilities and compensation.

Process:

1. Review the Qualtrics Form so you have the information you need to complete the form before you begin as it needs to be complete in one sitting. Global Engagement can provide you with a PDF of the form to review as well.

2. Complete the Qualtrics Form, including a letter of interest, and share preliminary course information.

3. Submit the Qualtrics Form by Sunday, October 27, 2024 at 11:59 pm CDT.

4. Obtain approval from your Department Chair and Dean. It is your responsibility to discuss your interest in the Faculty-in-Residence opportunity with them. Once you submit your application via Qualtrics an email will be sent to them for their official approval. They will need to give their approval by Friday, November 1, 2024.

5. Global Engagement will review applications. Finalists will be interviewed in November.

After you learn of acceptance:

6. Obtain curricular approval for the two courses you will teach abroad through the proper channels in your college/school. Work with your department chair and/or curriculum committee chair to determine what approvals are necessary. For instance,

sometimes topics courses have a different process and don't require full curricular approval, or if you are offering a course that already exists, you may only have to notify your department you are offering the course. Once you have verification from your department or curriculum committee that the course has been approved, please notify Global Engagement.

7. Obtain AOI approval from the university curriculum committee. Notify Global Engagement once you have approval.


- Your prior experience in the UK.

Courses

The Drake Faculty-in-Residence will teach two, 3-credit undergraduate courses meeting at least one AOI and taking advantage of the program location. Typically, one course will be a lower-level intro course with broad appeal, with the second course a topics course or elective. Drake students on the program will be required to take one of the two courses. These courses will also be open to other students on the Harlaxton program. Courses only need to be in the idea phase at this time. Having some flexibility in your final course offerings is encouraged.

Include up to four different courses you are interested in or open to teaching. Simply, tell me what you want to teach. Share how you envision course content and delivery will be enhanced by the program location. How will your courses integrate students into the host culture? What cultural activities might you incorporate into the courses? This will help you think more intentionally about how you can structure experiential learning in your courses and use the location as your classroom. Our on-site partner will also make suggestions.

Critical reflection is a key component to experiential learning ensuring students are making meaning of their experience. How might you facilitate student learning with reflection exercises throughout the program? Think about reflection activities, group discussion, individual journaling prompts, reflective essay, and more.
