


Our Students are Going Places! *96.8% Accomplishment Rate for A&S Undergraduates!

Accomplishment Rate: 96.8% (268/277)- based on information from 92.3% of our Aug. 2022, Dec. 2022, and May 2023 graduates) [National average is 85.7% (based on NACE knowledge of 56.7% of graduates)]

Here's what our A&S graduates are doing: 27.1% continuing education, 64.6% working (91.6% full-time and 8.4% part-time), 0.7% fellowship, 0.7% volunteering, 3.6% not seeking employment, 3.2% still seeking employment.

*Accomplishment rate is defined as the percentage of graduates who are employed, enrolled in graduate or professional school, involved in an activity related to professional goals (internship, volunteerism, residency, fellowship, or pursuit of second bachelor's degree), or elected not to pursue professional goals at this time.



Advising Corner

J-TERM 2024 GRADES: J-term 2024 grades are due by 10 a.m. on Wednesday, Feb 7.

ADD/DROP DEADLINES: Students have through 11:59 p.m. **Sunday, Feb 4** to add a course and through 11:59 p.m. on **Sunday, Feb 11**, by which to drop a course (without a W). If a student adds your course to their schedule, you will receive an automated confirmation email. Likewise, if a student drops your course, you will receive an automated confirmation email.

If you are allowing a student to add your course after Feb 4, the student must use the <u>add/drop form</u> to add your course. Once completed, the form should be directed to <u>studentsupport.as@drake.edu</u>

REGISTRATION OVERRIDES: You can complete registration overrides for students seeking a seat in your course. Please see these <u>instructions</u> on setting overrides. In some instances, a student may need more than one override, i.e., a pre-requisite is not met and the course is closed; both overrides need to be set to allow the student's registration. Setting registration overrides helps students to add coursework over weekends and afterhours, so as to have more immediate access to Blackboard materials. Setting the override does not register the student. The student must still take action to register by entering the course CRN. If you have a course(s) with a waitlist, please be mindful in allowing other students into that course as a seat offer(s) may have been extended. You do not wish to exceed the seating capacity in your classroom.


WAITLISTS: A limited waitlist function will continue **through noon on Friday, Feb 2**, allowing the student(s) on an existing waitlist to register for an open seat. Students will not be able to waitlist for new sections during the first week.

RESPONDING TO STUDENTS OF CONCERN: If you are concerned about a student in your course, please

raise a flag in Starfish which will prompt the appropriate office to follow-up. Another option is to complete the <u>early alert form</u>. The form feeds directly to the dean's office and facilitates our proactive outreach to students who need assistance and connections to key college and university resources.


