Faculty Transitions

We welcome two new full-time faculty this fall. Professor Sayoko Blodgett-Ford, our inaugural Edmund Sease Faculty Research Scholar, will teach in the Intellectual Property area. She brings a distinguished background in IP, including at Tetris Online, Inc and Nintendo. She is a prominent expert in Artificial Intelligence. We also welcome Professor Colleen Cullen as the new director of our Criminal Defense Clinic. Professor Cullen previously taught in the University of Denver's Criminal Defense Clinic and handled a wide range of criminal matters at the public defender's office in Milwaukee. Professor Andrew Jurs has departed Drake to teach at the McGeorge School of Law, University of the Pacific in Sacramento. Professor Julie Smith retired as director of the Legislative Practice Center. We welcome her successor, Professor Sydney Gangestad, who previously served as assistant director of the program.

Judge Mark Bennett announced in June his retirement from full-time teaching in December 2024. He will be taking a sabbatical research leave during the fall semester. His contributions to Drake Law have been tremendous. Our students have loved his classes in the crucial areas of racial equity and social change.
