

ASTIGATION OF THE STATE OF THE



SUPREME COURT DAY PROBLEM

For more than a year, from 1993 to 1994, a series of sexually-explicit telephone calls were made to minor girls in Albany, Iowa, by an unidentified male caller. The calls threatened rape of and sex acts with the children. Although the calls were often intercepted by parents, the intended recipients of these calls were usually elementary school girls who recently had been featured in the local newspaper or the elementary school newsletter. Several of the telephone calls were taped at the direction of the police.

After an investigation of these obscene telephone calls, Stephen Marcus was charged with five counts of criminal harassment. At trial, Marcus was required to participate in a demonstration in which he read from a transcript of one of the obscene telephone calls while the victims listened for voice identification purposes. In addition, again for voice comparison with the tape recordings, Marcus was compelled to read to the jury a transcript of a call, including vulgar and graphic language threatening sex acts with the children. His attorney objected to these demonstrations, arguing that they were prejudicial and falsely identified Marcus in the minds of the victims and the jurors with the obscene nature of the conversation. In addition, again over objection, the

court admitted into evidence photographs of Marcus taken when he was booked after his arrest. The "mug shots" included the name of the police department and a jail number for the defendant. The photograph was admitted for the purpose of establishing that Marcus had a beard at that time, a fact to which Marcus was willing to stipulate. Following the trial, Marcus was found guilty by the jury.

Stephen Marcus has appealed his conviction to the Supreme Court of the State of Iowa. First, he contends that the trial judge abused his discretion by requiring the defendant to participate in the demonstrations and repeat sexually explicit comments directed at children. He argues that his forced repeating of these obscenities was unduly prejudicial and inflammatory. Moreover, he believes that the inclusion of obscene language in the forced recitations was impermissibly suggestive and likely to cause misidentification of him with the harassing comments. The prosecution responds that the demonstration was necessary for the purpose of voice identification by the victims of the obscene phone calls and as a voice exemplar for comparison with the tape recordings.

Second, Marcus contends that the trial judge abused his discretion by allowing the booking photographs to be published to the jury. He argues that the mug shot photograph had little or no probative value, especially since it was not being used for visual identification purposes, and was prejudicial by implying the defendant has a criminal background. The prosecution responds that the photograph was necessary to establish that Marcus had a lengthy beard at the time of the events, given that the defendant's own expert witness had testified that facial hair could distort the sound of a voice through the telephone. The prosecution further argues that it was the province of the jury to weigh all of the evidence, to determine who was telling the truth, and to render the judgment.


