Student Dispositions

The Counseling Program began measuring and monitoring student dispositions in 2015 tracking six different dispositions across different classes. A complex matrix noted which disposition was measured in each class. The program sought to simplify and focus the disposition evaluation system. The faculty were also concerned about cultural implications of some of the previous dispositions. Specifically, *professionalism*, which was defined as ‘attire fitting to setting’, has been described as a social construct that reinforces oppression, particularly sexism, racism, and classism (Gray, 2019; Manthey, 2017; Negrete-Lopez et al., 2020; Rios, 2015). The review resulted in a new evaluation system of three dispositions, described below, which are rated by all instructors at the conclusion of each course. This process provides consistent and continual evaluation for all students.

<i>Disposition</i>	<i>Description</i>
Reflection	that demonstrates awareness of self and social identities; of skills, practices, and the profession of counseling; of role and actions in partnership with clients/students/consumers
Openness	to varying perspectives and experiences; to hear, acknowledge, and act upon feedback; to challenge oneself, others, and institutions/systems that are unjust
Commitment	to continuous learning and growth; to professional competence (coming to class prepared and on time; making informed contributions; working collaboratively) to accountability to students/consumers/clients and the counseling profession

Students are rated by instructors on a three-point system from 1 deficient, 2 marginal, and 3 meets. Students are then provided feedback through Starfish a campus wide advising platform. In addition to end of course ratings the ongoing surveys from program graduates and site-supervisors as well as annual surveys of employers provide another opportunity to gather information on dispositions. At the program level mean scores for each disposition are monitored across term as well as in courses where the ratings are highest and lowest. The faculty then review and discuss any curricular or program changes that might be undertaken in response to this data. Disposition information is also monitored over time to track any longitudinal changes. The new dispositions were implemented for the fall 2021 term so it will take several semesters before longitudinal data is available.

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Highlights from the 2023-2024 Academic Year

- The program is meeting the target performance in 86 out of 88 elements we monitor each year. This represents substantial improvement from the previous years. In addition, it is a single metric used in two different KPIs that is below the target and an item with a high performance in past years. The faculty are confident this metric will return to meeting the target in the coming year.
- The program is monitoring an additional eleven items which are at the threshold for meeting or slightly above the threshold. This approach allows us to potentially address areas of concern before performance drops below expected performance. While this is a higher number than in past years it does demonstrate how the program is actively monitoring and using the existing evaluation system to monitor program performance.
- The program evaluation system, revised prior to the 2021-2022 academic year continues to function very well. The faculty are able to monitor all 11 KPIs with actionable data to inform us of areas of concern. The evaluation process facilitates a data driven discussion to allow the faculty to devise and implement program changes with the goal of addressing identified concerns.
- The faculty have begun an additional revision to the evaluation system with the design of student level KPI monitoring and reporting. The faculty look forward to incorporating this new element into the evaluation system and report.
- Disposition ratings from faculty demonstrated continued consistency with faculty ratings now in line with student, supervisor, and employer. The faculty meeting regularly at the end of the term to discuss student concerns and celebrate strong student performance has supported the increased consistency in faculty use and rating in the disposition system.

Action Items for the 2024-2025 Academic Year

- Following the accreditation review and approval during the past year the faculty will work on developing a new student level KPI tracking system that monitors performance of KPIs at the student level and provides feedback to students, similar to the disposition system, at the end of each term with respect to their performance on each program KPI.
- KPIs will be reviewed based on the 2024 CACREP standards and updated as needed.

- Program faculty will complete review and implementation of the 2024 standards. Faculty will continue the review of COUN 201 Research in Counseling course standards to seek ways to improve the course and student performance.
- Maintain focus on case conceptualization skills given slight decline in one metric on this KPI. The faculty will review changes to the Diagnosis and Treatment Planning course to evaluate how the course overhaul was received by students and the new instructor.
- This item is being carried over from the previous year. The Practicum and Internship coordinator will reach out to site supervisors and employers to explore their specific expectations with respect to career development and career counseling so expectations can be integrated into program instruction.
- The faculty will also continue the review of the career KPI as we have demonstrated improvement in some of the metrics with some backsliding in others.
